Due to the rapidly-changing health crisis caused by COVID-19, the Office of Emergency Management and the Mayor are implementing the following additional measures pursuant to the Emergency Declaration Princeton issued on March 13, 2020:

- All meter regulations and all on-street permit parking regulations are suspended until further notice.
- All municipal buildings will be closed to the public from Tuesday March 17 through Friday March 20, and only essential employees will report to work. The purpose of the closure will be to enable municipal officials, the health officer, and the department of emergency management to implement proper protocols and train employees to continue providing essential government services to the public during this health crisis while adhering to proper safety measures.

Be further advised that today, Governor Murphy issued executive order 104 <https://nj.gov/infobank/eo/056murphy/pdf/EO-104.pdf> which ordered the following:

All bars, restaurants, gyms, movie theaters, and casinos in New Jersey (as well as New York and Connecticut) will be ordered to close at 8 pm Monday, March 16, 2020, and will remain closed until further notice to protect against COVID-19. Restaurants and bars will be permitted to offer takeout and delivery. Supermarkets and pharmacies will be open. All pre-k, k-12 schools, colleges and universities beginning March 18, 2020, will be closed. Gatherings of 50 persons or more are banned. Finally, Governor Murphy has announced that New Jersey is strongly discouraging any non-essential travel between 8pm – 5am.

We remind the public that it is important to adhere to these requirements and to continue taking essential safety precautions, including social distancing and frequent hand washing.

Princeton's officials are monitoring the situation on a continuous basis and are working closely with other municipalities in the County and State as well as with local, county and state health and emergency management officials. These directives will be modified or supplemented as the ever-changing situation warrants. In the meantime, we urge the public to check Princeton's website regularly for updates and above all else to stay safe.
